New Haven Promise, Higher Heights Youth Empowerment Program and CT Students for a Dream are joining forces to host a series of FAFSA workshops for the Class of 2021.

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is overseen by the U.S. Department of Education, the largest provider of student financial aid in the nation dispersing more than **\$120 billion** in federal grants, loans, and work-study funds annually to more than 13 million students paying for college.

Financial aid professionals will be on hand to help students and families navigate the process of need-based federal aid. **Below are the dates and students can sign up at FAFSANewHaven.org**. Sessions are capped at 100 participants. Those who sign up will receive a checklist of items that they will need to have during the workshop in order to successfully complete the process.
